Swimming: Kerlake quickest for club

SEAGULLS trio Ellie Kerlake, Alice Talbot and Megan Chapman dominated their age group to lead a 28-medal haul for the [Christchurch](#) and [New Milton](#) club at Haslemere.

The three 13-year-olds won 13 medals between them and produced a clean sweep of the top three medals in the overall Bagcats awards at the Elite short course meet.

Talbot was the leading medal-winner with gold in the 100 and 200m freestyle (1:03.87 and 2:18.67), 200m medley (2:41.02) and 50m breaststroke (38.28) and silver in the 100m breast (1:25.37).

But it's times not medals that count in the Bagcats points system and it was Kerlake who topped the age group overall with Talbot second and Chapman third.

Kerlake won a medal of each colour in the backstroke – gold in the 200m, silver in the 50m and bronze in the 100m (2:39.06, 34.47 and 1:14.47 respectively) and followed up with bronze in the 200m freestyle in 2:25.45.

Chapman's winnings included gold to Talbot's silver in the 100m breaststroke (1:24.75), silver behind Talbot in the 50m breaststroke (38.28) and bronze in the 200m medley and 50m backstroke (2:43.21 and 36.25).

Izzy Frampton claimed six medals in the 12yrs age group – gold on all three butterfly distances (50m 33.04, 100m 1:12.00 and 200m 2:38) and bronze in the 400m freestyle and 200 and 400m medley (4:54.01, 2:41.28 and 5:49.07).

Eleven-year-old Leana Galton won gold and bronze in the 11yrs 50m and 100m backstroke (38.59 and 1:22.42).

In the 13yrs boys' events, Chris Gannaway took gold in the 100m backstroke in 1:14.47, silver in the 200 and 400m freestyle (2:17.03 and 4:51.17) and bronze in the 100m free (1:03.67). In the same age group David Gallagher's time of 36.53 earned him a silver in the 50m breaststroke.
